Mike Flanagan is Consultant Nurse and Clinical Lead for the drug & alcohol services provided by Surrey & Borders Partnership NHS Foundation Trust in Surrey, the London Borough of Hounslow and in Brighton & Hove.

Mike has worked in the drug & alcohol field since 1991 in a range of clinical and academic settings. He qualified as a non-medical prescriber in 2006, and recognising the need for peer support for NMPs he established the National Substance Misuse Non-Medical Prescribing Forum.

From small beginnings this group has grown to have over 500 members; all nurse or pharmacist prescribers in the UK and Republic of Ireland. Mike chaired the expert group that wrote the Public Health England (PHE) guideline on NMP in alcohol and drug services. He co-chaired the group writing guidelines on the role of addiction nurses for PHE and the RCN and is a member of the expert group writing the 2017 Department of Health UK guidelines on the management of drug misuse ('The Orange Book').

In 2014 Mike was made a Fellow of the Royal College of Nursing for making an exceptional contribution to nursing and in 2017 he became a Florence Nightingale Foundation Leadership Scholar.

Graham Parsons



Graham Parsons has been a practicing pharmacist since 1991. After working in a variety of community pharmacy roles, Graham was invited to work alongside a GP Specialist in Substance Misuse in 2003 and joined NHS Plymouth in 2005 as a specialist medicines management advisor in substance misuse. In 2007 Graham became a prescriber within the Plymouth Primary Care Addiction Service and in 2009 became a Pharmacist with Special Interest in Substance Misuse.
